

## Sebert Wood Primary School – PE and Sport Premium Plan - 2016/2017

### Introduction

The PE Premium funding provides an excellent opportunity for the school to further improve its PE provision and to do so in the wider context of the Bury Schools Partnership, fully utilising the skills and experience across the group of schools. The Headteacher at Sebert Wood Primary School is part of the consultancy group for Suffolk Sport. He is also part of the panel who advertised, interviewed and appointed a trained professional to support schools in administering and coordinating the Bury Schools Partnership PE provision across the 20 schools. Sebert Wood is the contract holder and fund holding school on behalf of the partnership, and he is joint line manager for the sports coordinator.

### School Vision and Aims

Our vision and long term aims for the development of high quality physical education and physical activity at Sebert Wood.

*Through the delivery of high quality PE and an increased level of sports available for the children to participate in out of school hours, every child will leave our school enthused, motivated and inspired to continue participating in sports.*

### Key objectives

In order for Sebert Wood to achieve and maintain our vision we will focus on the following areas:

- Continue to be an active member of the Bury Schools Sport Partnership to allow us to access qualified coaches, competitions and support so that all children increase participation in a wider variety of sports and competitions
- Improving the PE experience for all children in the school and increase participation in all sport both curricular and extracurricular
- Increasing the subject knowledge of all teaching staff
- Monitoring the teaching of PE and ensuring it is of a high quality
- Asking for the children's feedback about the PE we teach in school and the clubs we offer out of school hours

### **Impact of PE Premium**

PE Premium money has been used to continue the contract for the sports co-ordinator for the Bury Schools Partnership. This has been very effective in increasing our participation in inter-school competitions. There is now a competition programme with one competition being held per month, and as a school, we endeavour to enter them all. Extracurricular sports clubs have also increased in the school. Links with local sport clubs and providers has been improved through the Sports Co-ordinator using the PE Premium funding to setup and subsidise them. Staff have benefitted from training sessions and by working alongside qualified coaches.

### **Participation in sport at Sebert Wood**

In the most recent parent survey, 88% of parents responded that their child enjoys PE and extracurricular sports activities at Sebert Wood. Only 19% of parents responded that their child prefers to attend sports clubs outside of school.

59% of pupils have participated in sports clubs at school

78% of pupils participate in sports activities/clubs outside of school

23% of pupils attend the school football team training and competitive matches

32% of pupils play for a sports team outside of school

38% of pupils have played in a school team (other than the school football team). *This is primarily Key Stage 2 pupils, as competitive matches through the Bury Schools Partnership are currently for Key Stage 2 pupils.*
