OUR CURRICULUM AIMS

We aim for all children to:

- Experience a broad, balanced curriculum with exciting, engaging and memorable learning and opportunities that interest and enthuse them, enabling them to reach their full potential.
- listen attentively and communicate clearly and confidently in a range of ways for various occasions and purposes;
- learn how to acquire information from a variety of sources, and record information and findings in different ways;
- read fluently with understanding, feeling and expression;
- understand the application of mathematical ideas in various situations;
- apply a range of calculation skills with speed and accuracy;
- develop a legible style of handwriting and high standards of spelling, grammar and punctuation;
- develop religious and moral understanding and tolerance of religious beliefs of others;
- understand and make use of appropriate equipment and technological resources;
- develop computing skills and the application of these across the curriculum;
- observe and respect living and inanimate things, to recognise characteristics such as pattern and order;
- master basic scientific ideas, investigate solutions, interpret evidence and analyse and solve problems;
- know about geographical, historical and social aspects of the local environment and national heritage,
- be aware of other times and places, to recognise links between local, national and international events;
- use music, drama and various forms of the arts as a means of expression;
- experience free and structured play involving a wide range of equipment to aid growth and development;
- develop agility, confidence and co-ordination in physical activity and the ability to express feeling through movement;
- provide opportunities for pupils to engage in competitive sports and activities, inside and outside of school.
